FOR THE
EPA NEW LEAD RENOVATION, REPAIR, AND PAINTING (RRP) PROGRAM
BEGINNING APRIL 22, 2010**

**With fines starting at \$37,500 per occurrence--do not catch yourself unprepared.
Cost of training that is good for 5 years is \$200.00.**

Under the new EPA RRP rule, beginning April 22, 2010, all contractors (painters, remodeling firms, maintenance workers, and others) performing renovation, repair and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in houses, apartments, child care facilities, and schools built before 1978 must be certified. Firms, including schools, must have at least one "**Certified Renovator**" assigned to jobs where lead-based paint is disturbed. The RRP law has many new communication, paint testing, work practice, and final cleaning requirements that have to be met.

To become a **Certified Renovator**, the individual must successfully complete the Renovator initial course conducted by an EPA or State-accredited RRP training provider. AAA Environmental is providing these courses in conjunction with the nonprofit organized The CASE Institute. The CASE Institute has approval from NC-DHHS and is currently waiting for EPA approval. The NC-DHHS approval will be accepted in South Carolina and other EPA states.

North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services will be regulating their state. South Carolina will be regulated under the EPA Region IV agency.

Child-occupied facilities are defined as residential, public, or commercial buildings where children under six and under are present on a regular basis. The requirements apply to renovation, repair, or painting activities of six square feet of lead-based paint on the interior and/or 20 square feet of lead-based paint on the exterior is disturbed during the work activity, including the replacement of one or more windows.

This 1-day course was developed by the U.S. EPA, in collaboration with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to train renovation, repair, and painting contractors and maintenance workers how to work safely in housing and buildings with lead-based paint and to comply with EPA's Renovation, Repair, and Painting (RRP) Rule, and HUD's Lead Safe Housing Rule.

Even if you have Lead Supervisor or Worker accreditation, this class is mandatory.
